CONSERVATION GRANT

GUIDANCE NOTES

The Primate Society of Great Britain awards small grants in support of primate conservation and education. These grants are administered by the Conservation Working Party, the members of which consider applications at their biannual meetings. The following notes give details of eligibility and application procedure and should be read carefully before preparing an application.

1. Proposals are invited for grants to assist:

- 1.1 Research of benefit to primate conservation;
- 1.2 Short surveys to identify locations of value to primate conservation;
- 1.3 Projects involving conservation education relevant to primates.

2. Obligations of grantees are:

- 2.1 To present a report on the progress of the project after 6 months for long-term projects;
- 2.2 To present a final report within 3 months of completion of the project, to be used by PSGB at its discretion in publications or in any way thought to be of value to primate conservation;
- 2.3 To provide, within 3 months of completion of the projection, a 500 word summary of the project for publication in Primate Eye and on the PSGB website
- 2.4 To acknowledge the support received from PSGB in all publications or materials resulting from the project, and to supply PSGB with two copies of each;
- 2.5 To provide, if possible, some illustrations to be used on the PSGB website to promote primate conservation and grants
- 2.6 To produce, where appropriate, slides and/or sound recordings for non-commercial use by PSGB or others in the promotion of primate conservation.

3. Eligibility

- 3.1 Grants will be awarded to members of PSGB, or to citizens of primate range states who are sponsored by a member.
- 3.2 Only those projects which are judged to have attainable goals that will benefit primate conservation or conservation education will be considered.
- 3.3 Group training projects will not be considered for these grants.
- 3.4 Undergraduate expeditions and commercial/adventure missions will not normally be supported.
- 3.5 Awards are made on a competitive basis, and the decision of the Conservation Working Party is final. In some cases applicants may be

invited to submit an amended application.

4. Application and award details

- 4.1 Individual awards tend to be in the range of £250 to £750.
- 4.2 Application must be made on the Application Form, or following the same format.
- 4.3 Two closing dates apply: the last day of February and the last day of August.
- 4.4 Applications should be sent by post to reach the Convenor on or before the relevant closing date.
- 4.5 Applications must be submitted as a signed hard copy and as an electronic copy (by e-mail or on floppy disk). Applications submitted solely by e-mail will not normally be accepted.
- 4.6 Successful applicants will be required to sign the "Undertaking by Grantees" form prior to release of funds.
